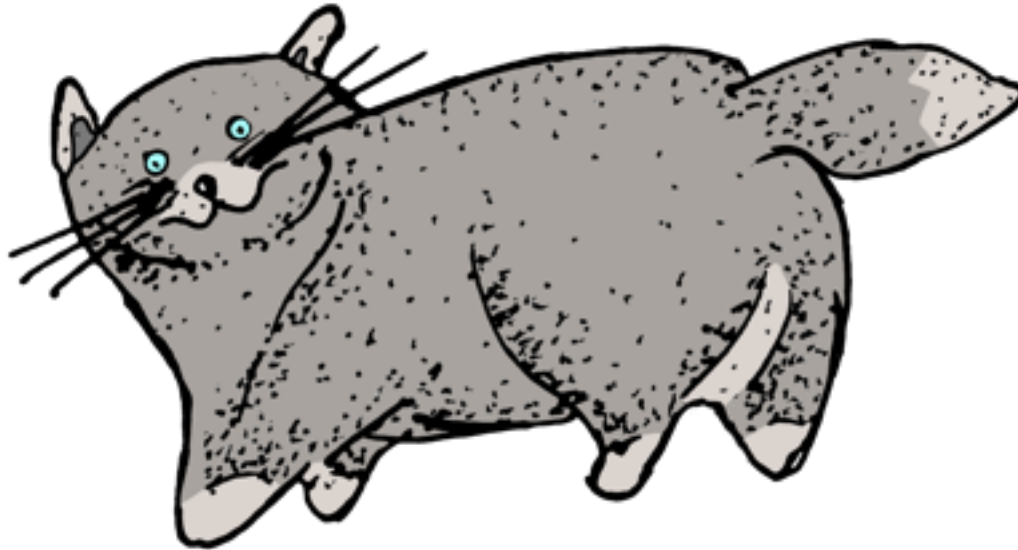


What to expect
